How to find us

We are situated approximately 3 miles outside Newbury town centre, in easy reach of the M4 (Junction 13) and A34 roads. The postcode for navigation systems is RG20 8AE. Free on-site parking is available. There are good rail links from Reading and London Paddington, with taxis and public transport available from Newbury.

Parking

Free on-site parking is available. There are six disabled parking bays, three of which are bookable in advance via the Box Office.
